Our school is looking fabulous with the corridor, Art Room, F-2 and 3-6 rooms being freshly painted. We have new concrete paths and the area for our new playground has been set up ready for its installation in August. Exciting times for our school.

## **TIMETABLE**

Attached to today's newsletter is a copy of the fortnightly timetable which outlines the curriculum covered throughout a two week period. This term 'inquiry based learning' will focus on the geography and history curriculum areas including Aboriginal Studies. Our junior students will focus on 'then and now' and cover a range of concepts relating to how daily life of the present is different from the past and how it could change in the future. Our senior students will explore a range of concepts relating to the stories of the First Fleet; including reasons for the journey, who travelled to Australia, their experiences following arrival and the impact colonisation had on Indigenous Australians. Buddies sessions will continue on a fortnightly basis as per Semester One and will focus on an introduction to Aboriginal Art. Friday afternoons we will continue our focus on sustainability and the community garden.

## **COMMUNITY FOODIES – PARTNERING WITH SOUTHWEST HEALTHCARE**

Lismore Primary School and South West Healthcare have partnered to engage in a pilot program focussing on Healthy foods. This is a fantastic opportunity for our students to learn from experts and participate in hands on learning. Students in years 3-6 will participate in five sessions run over the first five weeks of Term 3. This week, South West Healthcare Dietician Casey Weel will present a session called '*Eat More Whole Foods*' to our 3-6 students. The session will focus on the five different food groups, serving sizes of different foods and health benefits from each of the food groups.

Next *Thursday July 25th*, our whole school will travel to Warrnambool to engage in a tour and educational activity at the Warrnambool Community Garden facilitated by an expert. This will allow our students the opportunity to build upon the knowledge they have gained working in our school community garden as well as learn from experts in this area. Lismore Primary School is excited to be introducing weekly lunch orders. Lunch orders will be provided by the local Birdcage Café each Friday. Please note our school encourages healthy eating and we would appreciate your support in ensuring healthy food choices. Foods such as chicken nuggets and fish fingers are not appropriate school lunch choices.

## **Tasty Tuna Noodles**

#### Makes 2 serves

#### Ingredients:

1 pkt 2 minute noodles (discard the flavour sachet)

 $1 \times 110$ g can of tuna in tomato and onion sauce

1/4 cup grated carrot

1/4 cup grated zucchini

grated cheese (optional)

Method:

- Break up the 2 minute noodles.
- Mix raw noodles, grated carrot and grated zucchini together.
- Cook noodles (with the grated vegetables in it) according to instructions, then drain.
- Mix through the tuna in tomato and onion sauce and cheese (optional).

- Pack into two small containers.
- Refrigerate unused portion until required (for up to 2 days).

## Lismore Supported Playgroup

Thank you for your interest in the Lismore Supported Playgroup incorporating the smalltalk program. This Playgroup is about supporting parents to provide enriching home learning opportunities for their young children. A facilitator will share information and ideas around parenting and child development in a relaxed setting. Some of the topics will include - teachable moments, being warm and gentle and following your child's lead.

A Family Transition plan will be developed together in consultation with all families and the facilitator. The purpose of the Family Transition Plan is to ensure that families are supported to access services that will assist them at the end of their participation in the Supported Playgroup. This may include Community led Playgroups, Childcare, Kindergarten, Specialist children's services etc.

There is also a Home Coaching component available to eligible families, which allows you to explore these ideas further in your own home. A Home Coach may visit you if you wish at a time suitable to you and your child each fortnight.


