On high jump I jumped so high, and I was good and I flipped onto the mat. **Leo**

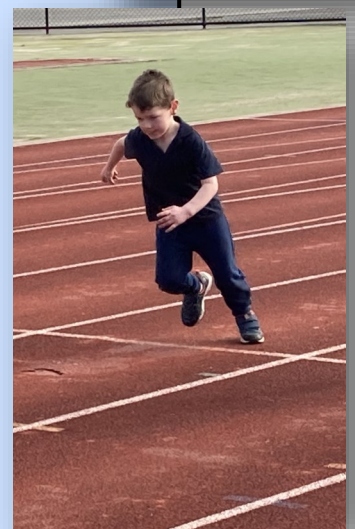
I stayed for the big race and got a 'well done' ribbon. **Sammy**
