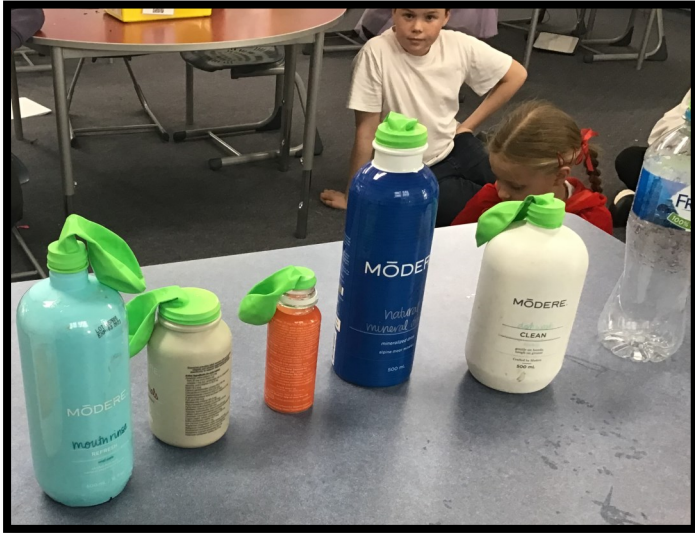


F-2 We had fun making a 'twirly' toy from the past.

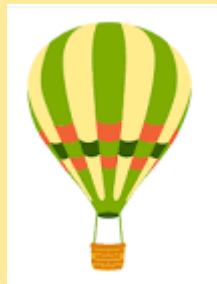
