WRITING INQUIRY CYCLE

During the final 4 weeks of Term 3, staff were undertaking an inquiry cycle where we focussed on the use of punctuation in students writing. This focus was identified through collaborative analysis of student writing samples from their Cold Writes, where we determined this to be an area where we could make progress in both classrooms. For the 4-week period, students writing lessons were focused on different types of punctuation, how and where to use them, and editing to include missed punctuation. The hope was that students would be more confident in their use of punctuation, and that this would translate into a willingness to experiment with punctuation, and ultimately accurate use of punctuation. On Monday night, we analysed the post-assessment writing samples, and were very pleased to see that 89% of all punctuation-based criteria had been achieved. We also evaluated these pieces of writing for our next inquiry cycle. It was identified that our next focus would be word choice, specifically linking ideas and connectives to help pieces of writing flow.

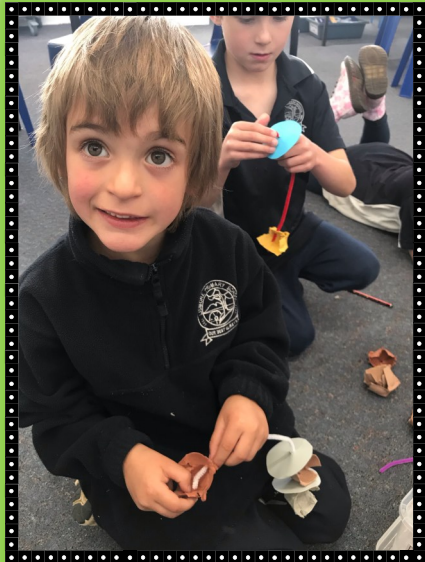

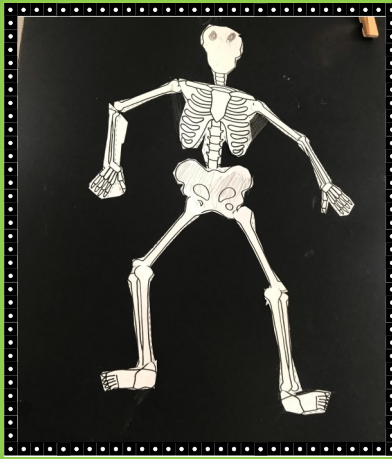
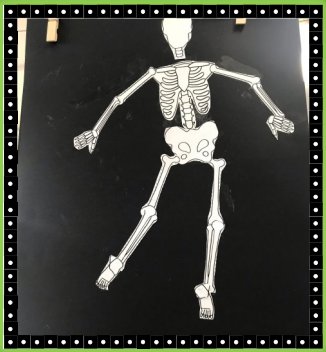
