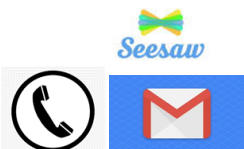

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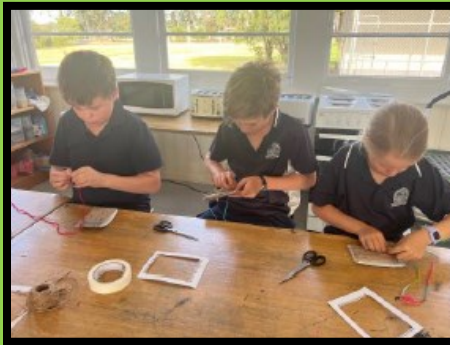

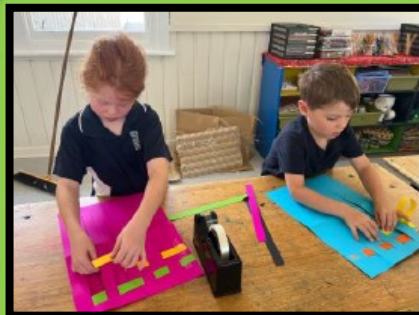


We used straws to create bracelets or keyrings.

Finally, last week students were given spelling words to practise. These lists have been generated from the data I collected when students completed the South Australian Spelling Test (SAST).










This a standardised test of spelling achievement for students in the age range 6 years to 15 years. All students have been given a spelling choice grid and they have been instructed to choose one activity a day. When they feel confident/comfortable they are to come to myself or Pauline for their spelling test. This approach allows all students to learn at their own pace, and not be under any pressure.

Alphabetical Order: Put your words into alphabetical order forwards or backwards. apple banana cake	Words within Words! Find hidden words within your list words, e.g. here – he, her football – foot, ball, all, tall, fool	Cloze Exercise: Use a picture clue or just a sentence with the missing word, e.g.  The _____ chewed on his bone.	Rhyming Words: Can you find other words to rhyme with your spelling list words? trestle wrestle
Word Shapes: Draw a box around each one of your list words. Then ask a friend to guess the word for each box. 	Word Tree: Make up a word tree by adding to a word, e.g. walk-walked walking 	Crosswords: Use word or picture clues to make up a crossword using your list words. Swap with a partner and complete. 	Dictionary Target With a partner and a dictionary each, one player calls out a word from your list. Both players open up the dictionary as close as possible to the word's page. Closest page wins. Recipe Words Your task is to write a crazy recipe using as many words from your list as possible. 	Newspaper Report Write a newspaper article using as many words from your list as possible. 	CD Cover Words Design a CD cover using your words in the title and of the CD and the names of the songs. 	Post Card Design a post card front and back. On the back write a message that contains at least 6 of your list words.
