CURRICULUM

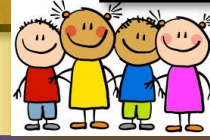

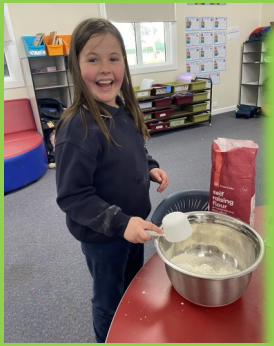
F-2 The F-2 students have enjoyed learning about the Olympics so far and are looking forward to watching some events together as a class this week!
